STI TESTING OPTIONS AND INFORMATION

If you have symptoms, your provider will discuss the most appropriate test and treatment. If you do not have symptoms but wish to have screening tests done, the following tests are available.

*Lab charges will be placed on your student account. You may ask for a copy of your receipt to send to your insurance company.

GONORRHEA/CHLAMYDIA

- 2 WEEKS after exposure earliest recommended time to test
- Urine Sample or Vaginal Swab
- For most accurate results do not urinate in the 60-90 minutes before your appointment
- Throat and Rectal swabs are recommended in certain cases

SYPHILIS (RPR)

- 1-3 MONTHS after exposure earliest recommended time to test
- Blood sample
- If this test is POSITIVE, more specific testing is done

HIV

- 2 WEEKS to 6 MONTHS (usually 1-3 Months) after exposure earliest recommended time to test
- Blood sample
- If test is POSITIVE, confirmatory testing is done

HERPES (CULTURE)

- Testing can only be performed on an active sore/lesion
- Swab of sore/lesion required
- If the culture is POSITIVE, more specific testing is done

Trichomoniasis

- Test 3-14 DAYS after exposure
- Genital Swab
